That the stand for those plying with Horses & Cars shall be on the  
Ship Quay between the Kings Stairs & the Old Market House, at the distance  
of 12 feet at least from the door of any Dwelling house, Office or Merchants  
Store, for those plying with Mules or Cows, in the Lane adjoining the  
Kings Stairs; if found standing any where else when unemployed, they  
shall be subject to the penalty of 5<sup>s</sup>.

That no Carrman shall have priority from his early appearance on  
the stand each day - but the Employer may select such as he deems  
best Qualified to do his work, without reducing the stated fare;  
and no Carrman shall appear on the Stand without a proper  
Horse or Cowl for drawing Coal or Turf if called upon, Under  
penalty of 5<sup>s</sup>.

That each Carrman shall be Licensed & Registered, his Car  
Numbered, the name of the Owner painted thereon in large letters;  
and none shall ply for hire except those regularly Licensed under  
Penalty of 20<sup>s</sup> for each offence.

That each Carrman who shall refuse to take a load when  
called on; or shall not load his Car or Cart without delay  
or shall insult his employer, or shall leave his Horse  
without a proper person to attend him, or shall drive his  
Car or Cart through the Street at a greater pace than is  
or shall not lead his Horse by the Collar or Bridle shall be  
subject to the Penalty of 5<sup>s</sup> for each offence -

That no Carrman shall demand more Fare than mentioned  
in the Schedule, or claim payment for more loads than he  
has drawn Under penalty of 5<sup>s</sup>.

That any Carrman who shall surt his Horse & Car or  
refuse going with the Military Baggage shall be  
penal

For every 20<sup>th</sup> and every two Corners playing with Cows or Mules shall provide a Horse & Car bands a like penalty.

That the 1<sup>st</sup> Stage shall be to or from the Quay to the Head of Castle Street & Richmond Street, the Near Corner of Sugarhouse Lane & on Paddy M<sup>rs</sup> Davis Corner - The 2<sup>d</sup> Stage into Castle Street & Richmond Street Upper part of the Quay Street to the Diamond, to the New Weigh House from New Gate end of Castle Street, to Butcher Street, to the Lower part of Rosemary Lane, and Linen Hall, to the Lime House, into Sugarhouse Lane & William Street - The 3<sup>d</sup> Stage, Diamond, Butcher Street - Ferryway Street, Bishop's Street within the Gate, and all other Streets or Lanes within the Gate not already mentioned. The 4<sup>th</sup> Stage, outside Bishop's-gate & over the Bridge to Waterside.

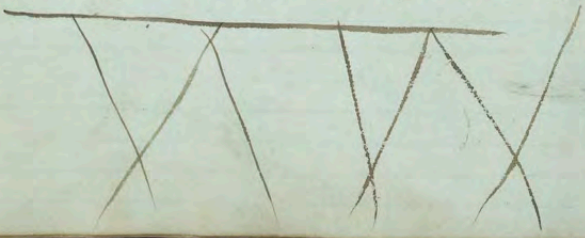

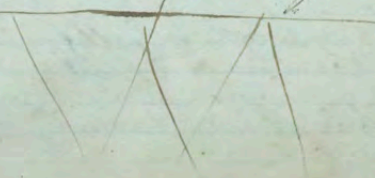

 1<sup>st</sup> A Lease for Sixty one years to Commence from Lady Day next at the yearly Rent of Five Hundred pounds, of the Ship Quay premises, as the same now stand including all that Space of Ground with the Buildings thereon and extending on the South side from London Bulwark to the River Foyle, including Mr. Wilson's premises, and on the North side from the Site of Chichester Bulwark along Foyle Lane or Street down to the River, Together with the New Quay adjoining thereto, And also of Tommyburns Mill and Serisks excluding the lands of Springtown and Coglass, The said premises to be set out and particularly delineated and described in Maps three of to be annexed to the said Lease, which Lease shall contain a special Covenant on the part of the Corporation with respect to the Ship Quay, that no Buildings shall be in future Erected thereon without License in writing from the Society.

2<sup>nd</sup> A similar Lease at the Yearly Rent of Forty pounds of the side of Wapping next the City Wall, and of all such Houses, buildings and premises within the limits of Fleet Street including Darcus's holdings surrounding the Wall East of Londonderry, as are now in the Tenure or Occupation of the said Corporation or their Undertakants, with all the Maps as directed in the last mentioned Lease, with Covenant to put and keep the buildings in fit repairs and a restriction, that the City Wall shall be preserved and kept up for the use and accommodation of the Inhabitants.

Chamberlain The Mayor acquainted the Common Council that Election he had summoned them this day for the Purpose of Electing a Chamberlain in the room of the late Joseph Curry Esq<sup>r</sup> deceased;

Burgess Samuel Curry is this day unanimously elected Chamberlain of the Corporation

Chamberlain ordered that the report of the Committee appointed on the 2<sup>d</sup> of Nov<sup>r</sup> 1819 accounts for the Investigation of the Chamberlain's accounts & this day read & confirmed which report is as follows

We whose Names are hereunto subscribed Members of the Committee appointed by the Corporation of the 2<sup>d</sup> of November Instant have this day in pursuance of the Order of the Common Council called upon the Executors of the late Chamberlain for the several documents, Memorials, books & Records belonging to this Body and remaining in their Custody, which were accordingly handed over to us, & we also in Obedience to said Order have investigated the accounts of the said late Chamberlain, and carefully examined the different sums debited to the Corporation, & compared them with the Vouchers and receipts for the same, & we find said Accounts perfectly correct, & that the Balance due to the Corporation up to this day is £3,620. 11. 4<sup>1/2</sup>.

Your Committee further beg leave to state that in further discharge of their duty, they thought it necessary to call upon the said Executors for a Correct List of all the Bonds which have been passed & Sealed both before & since the appointment of the late Chamberlain & now outstanding against the Corporation conceiving it absolutely necessary that the Common Council should be in possession of the exact amount & extent of those securities, & the said Return having been made to us by the Executors, it appears that the same amounts to the Sum of £58,716. 8. 10 & we have hereunto Annexed a Correct List of said Securities with their respective dates & to whom the same were payable for the information of the Corporation.

We further beg leave to state it to be our Opinion & we recommend it to the consideration of the Common Council that a standing Committee consisting of the Mayor & three Members of the Council shall be now Nominated & also be appointed Annually on the second of November, and that 3 Members shall be called the Seal Committee, & that the Mayor shall have the Custody of the Publick Seal of the Corporation, but that no Bond shall be hereafter executed by the Chamberlain to any person for any Sum of Money whatsoever, nor sealed with the Seal of this Corporation without the Knowledge, sanction & Order in writing of s<sup>d</sup> Committee or the Majority of them of which Majority the Mayor for the time being always to be one, said Order to be Lodged & remain with the Chamberlain.

We further beg leave to state to the Common Council that all the Documents, Memorials, books, Papers & other publick Records of the Body are in preparation of being Numbered & scheduled & entered into a particular Book kept for the purpose so that the same can be immediately referred to when required.

Your Committee have much satisfaction in stating that there has been no increase of the debt of the Corporation since the last Settlement of the accounts, and that notwithstanding the expensive Works carrying on at the Bridge, no Money whatever has been borrowed except what has been regained, and disposed of in the liquidation of Outstanding securities, And your Committee indulge the hope that from the successful labours & exertions of the Gentlemen who composed the Deputation appointed to treat with the Society (by which the Title of the Corporation to their several Properties has been legally & substantially acknowledged & confirmed) The Public Credit of the Body will be now firmly established, and that they will be enabled from henceforth gradually to discharge the public debt affecting their property, all which we humbly submit to the consideration of the Corporation this 8<sup>th</sup> Day of November 1819
