Report of the Deputation to London appointed by order
of Council the 23^d of Sept^r 1831

In consequence to their Communications with the Treasury the Deputation
had learn to report, That agreeable, to the Instructions they had rec^d they soon after
their arrival in London addressed a Letter to Lord Althorpe on the 14th of October,
repeating the Statement of the grounds on which they Com^d: that the Corporation of
London should be entitled to further Indulgence, and soliciting an Interview with his
Lordship of which Letter the following is a Copy;

Bath's Hall 14 Oct. 1831

My Lord

"I had the Honor of receiving a Com^{nt}: from the L^{ds}. Com^{rs} of
his Maj^{ty}: Treasury dated the 29th ult^o respect^g the Debt due by the Corp^{: of} Londⁿ to
Gov^t: which was forward^d to me by Serj^{: at} Law, & which with a similar Com^{nt}: to the Mayor
of that City was laid before the Com^{: Council of} the Corp^{: of} Londⁿ on the 6th Inst^{: who} feeling
every wish to Com^d: to all Intend^{ts}: & find Leniency with their L^{ds}: Bishop, on
the Subject of the Loan, & accordingly authorized a Deput^{: of} them, & I, to proceed
to London to wait upon your L^{ds}: Bishop, for the Attainment of the Object which they hope
have every reason to hope will be accomplished with Satisfaction to the Govern^{mt}."

I have been requested by that Deputation to
submit an Interview with your L^{ds}: Bishop, & at the same time to prep^{: upon} your L^{ds}: Bishop,
attent^{ly} the Treasury Minute of July 10 21, by which the Corp^{: of} Londⁿ was at
that time relieved from further pay^{mt}: which Com^d: permanent unless
they was called upon by the L^{ds} of the Treas^{:y} last year for repayment; I beg to
submit to your L^{ds}: Bishop that under these Circumstances it is a Case of public
Necessity, to call upon the Corp^{: of} Londⁿ to pay Interest on a sum of Money (for the
Dispayment ^{of which} they had the sanction of the Treasury of 1821) diminished as the Income
has been by the late Treasury regulation.

The Corp^{: of} Londⁿ are strongly impreg^{ed} with the opinion
that under the strict Construction of the Statute a very serious question might be
raised upon the part of the Treasury to demand Interest upon the Stock which
remains of sufficient to maintain goodly relations with the Govern^{mt}, &
to avoid every Embarrassment with regard to the Interest by payment to
the publick the Com^d: of the Corporation & the Corp^{: of} Londⁿ that they are
disposed to abandon at once any defense to the proceed^g of the Com^{nt} &
to permit the Com^d: order to be made absolute which has been long
obtained for a Deputation: so that it shall not be second^d to enable a Deputation
made in pursu^{nt}: of the same furnished at my hand as Serj^{: at} Law.

I have the honor to inform your L^{ds}: Bishop that
his opinion that the Interest should be paid on the Debt & as the
Deputation will be prepared at the Interview with your L^{ds}: Bishop
My

They have the honor to select on as early a day as convenient to submit such a
 proposal for the repayment and security of the Debt, by Parliament as well they
 trust must be glad to see Approv'd. I have the honor to be &c &c

From the press of business consequent on the Prorogation of Parliament
 his R^d Ship could not receive us till Monday the 17th at 11 of the Clock
 how the Report^r waited upon his R^d Ship arriv'd. by Mr. Dawson (whom I had known
 to have been for the purpose) the R^d Ship's Order to call of
 whom they consider themselves under oblig'd. In the Conference on the 18th their
 advocacy of their Cause — they have no doubt that the County Members would

We beg also to return your sincere thanks for the
pse. promissory with which you granted us an audience — the attention and
kindness with which you listened to our statements & the favorable terms you
have granted to the Corporation —

Altho' from the language adopted, by the Secretary of the Treasury in
drawing up the Minute, there appears a disposition to throw upon the Corp^o
the task of procuring an Act of Parlt^o to give it effect, yet the Corporation
confidently expect that the Chancellor of the Exchequer will take care to provide
by law for the Arrangements he has entered into with the Corporation —

Copy Minute 28 Oct. 1831

The Chancellor of the Exch^r informs the Board that he has read in purport
from the Mayor & Corp^o of Lond^o a paper which is supposed to have been signed & then
been published in the following effect (this follows the copy of the letter from
the Dep^y of the 1st of Oct. 1831 & the note which accompanied it), "Receiving
the whole of the transaction, and considering the departure from the Revision of
the Act of Parlt^o which was permitted by the Treasury Minute of the 10th of May 1821 &
the great hardship which would be imposed upon the Cred^o of the Corporation if the ordinary
were the immediate repayment of the sum due enforced by a continuation of adverse
legal process, the Chancellor of the Exch^r submits to the Board whether the
following arrangement may not meet the equity of the Case; That the Corporation of Lond^o
should repay the whole of the Debt due from them to the Crown of £15000, including
equal to £13846, 11 3, 1 British together with Interest at the rate of 3 per cent on
the said amounts then due, amounting to £2492, 6, 2 British Currency within the
Space of 20 y^{rs} from & after the 1st of January 1832, by equal instalments of
£26, 18, 5, each that is to say the 1st Instalment to be paid on the 1st of January 1832
The said Sum of £26, 18, 5 to be paid on the 1st of January in each succeeding year
until the whole amount of the Debt together with the 3rd Interest shall be discharged
The order for signature of the bills of the Bridge to be made absolute by consent of the Dep^y
but said Liquidation not to be put in force, until a default shall be made in any of the
instalments above, & inasmuch as the said Arrangement was made under the sanction of the
Legislature, which it would be highly objectionable for the part of the Board of Treasury, by any act
of theirs to vary or discharge, the Chancellor of the Exch^r & suggests that no further
step can be taken than to inform the Corp^o of Lond^o that no objection will be
made on the part of the Government to the introduction of a Bill into Parlt^o during the
next session for the purpose of carrying this Minute into effect by law, & that the
concern in the recommendation — Write in the terms of this Minute to the Mayor & Corp^o of Lond^o
Write also to Mr Stanley for the Inform^o of his Excellency the Govern^r of Ireland Request that he
will move his Excellency to give assent to the law of Queen's Bench to be paid legal proceedings
against the Corp^o of Lond^o for the proposed application to Parlt^o and being taken that in case the
arrangement as suggested should not meet the approval of Parlt^o the proceeds in Clearance of the
Corporat^o shall continue to be carried on as if the said Bill had not been made

The Deputations having then concluded the Negotiations, with the Chancellor of the Duchy, proceed. & followed by the said Noble Lord a conference with the said Society, they were accompanied on this occasion by Mr Dawson Esq. a Gentleman of the Robt. Prison a Member of the Corpⁿ - Reformers having informed the Deput^s that a Commission of a late Duke had read from them to read Com^{rs} the Society, desired the Deput^s to state what objects they had in declining that Intermixⁿ; In Robert Dawson opened the Course of the day, by a Curious Detail of the History of the Society, the Corporation, of the original pecuniary Inalienable Letters on the General Settlement of the Plantation, more especially by the Grant of the 1500 acres, which he alleged had been set apart as an Estate for the Support & Maintenance of the Majesty & Principal Establishments of Berwy; It was shown by what means that Valuable property was taken away from the Corporation & put into the hands of the Society, and among several other instances made to the Letter for the independent Surrender of an Independent income to this it was added that the Society suddenly encroached the rent from £150 Rent at which it had remained for nearly two Centuries to £600 a year, while at the same time they deprived the Corporation of a Valuable property with the Churches, worth £400 a year; that the Corporation relying upon the possessions they had enjoyed for a period of 200 years, had contributed in various publick Works, advantageous to the Community, but far from profitable to themselves, by means of which they had become deeply involved in Debt, that altho' there was a considerable quantity of property in such all their Engagements; yet that these Affairs were so entangled it would be impossible to go on with respectability & Honour or advantage to the publick without some efficient Relief from the Society - Mr Dawson also addressed the Society, touching the Importance of Sustaining a Corporation which had done so much for the City of Berwy & improved the Estate of the Society, & represented Sir Arthur Chichester bore similar Testimony, and the other Members of the Deputation having adressed their observations as appeared to them desirable had any specific proposal to make. & suggested that the regular Course would be to put such proposal in writing and lay it before the Society on another day, the Deputation soon afterwards withdrew but not before several questions were asked by different Members of the Society respecting the title of the Duchy & the Matters, bearing an agreement with the affairs of the Corporation that must have been communicated by so friendly Friends - On the following day

October the 18th. The Deputation addressed & forwarded the following
 Memorial; "To the Honble the Just. Society - Gentlemen; The Deputation
 of the Corporation of Doncaster having in the Conference which they had
 the honor of holding with the Society on Monday last explained the
 actual Condition of the Affairs, the reasons which prompted them to call
 for assistance, and the Duties they conceive the Society have to discharge.
 have now the honor in Compliance, with the wishes of the Society to lay
 before them a proposal for their Consideration; by the Statement annexed
 it will fully appear that there will not be adequate funds for the support
 of the Magistracy, of the payment of their legal obligations specified
 thereon, and therefore that the Municipal establishments of Donc. must
 fall to the ground, unless sustained by the Society; The Deputation
 conceive that after the lengthened obstructions, which the Subject has
 incurred; it is unnecessary to enlarge on the Confusion & Mischiefs
 attend on such a Misfortune - The Government have viewed the
 Matter so strongly in the light, that they have consented to an arrangement
 for the liquidation of the £15000, advanced for the repairs of the Bridge
 by what the Corporation are allowed 20 years to pay that debt off
 by annual Instalments of £500, having obtained three favorable
 Terms from Government, the Deputation hope that the Society will take
 these Case and Circumstances into Consideration, under the Head & improved
 aspect of Affairs, and that they will declare that the Magistracy and
 Municipal establishments of Donc. specified in the second Schedule
 must be supported, The Deputation therefore in Conclusion on
 behalf of the Corporation propose, that the Society should undertake
 to support the Magistracy & allow the Corporation £500 a year for

applicable to the Improvement of the Harbour & Quay's, leaving £150 a year for repair of markets & payment to Breachers — and no provision for the support of the Magistracy — The second schedule, I specified the Salaries of the Mayor & Officers of the Corporation — The Society assembled on Wednesday the 14th to take the foregoing Memorial into Consideration on which occasion the Deputation was again in attendance, but the Society separated without coming to any determination except upon the Verbal request of the Deputation to permit the subdivision of these Leases into several tenures for a more convenient allotment, at the sale which they offered to, and then adjourned until that day week, at which time they expressed that the result of the sales would be known: London

The Deputation having known of the permission to divide the property thought conceived it their duty to recommend an adjournment of these sales in order to carry that permission into effect altho it should imperially protect the Proprietors with the Society who seemed resolved to be satisfied with the reality of our doubts and accordingly we furnished the Chamberlain with a letter to the Auditor advising a postponement which accordingly took place —

On Wednesday the 26th of Oct^r the Deput^{ns} (deprived however of the assistance of the Chamberlain) again waited upon the Society, but after waiting 2 hours in Attendance were informed by the departure of several members that the Court had broken up, and soon after had the Modification to learn that they had again adjourned the consideration of the question — Feeling deeply hurt by this proceeding that seemed intended to baffle, with them, and avoid any settlement of Corporation affairs, and being quite to understand that Charges of 2^d the efficiency of the Corpⁿ had been made, calculated to prejudice them & injure their Cause, the Deputation without loss of time addressed our favour and the following statement;

To the Honourable the Irish Society

Gent^l "The Deputation has to express with deep regret the decision to which the Committee of the Society came to on Wednesday in postponing the consideration of the question whether they will or will not support the Magistracy of Lerry, The Deputation are at a loss to understand the reason of such a proceeding, seeing that the question is one of simplicity —

They respectfully Submit that they are entitled to a clear distinct and unequivocal answer, and that the Society might not be kept in a state of such moment to the City of Jersey or with the Deputation whose members have no business or concern but to bring their Conference to a final close, If the Society grant the relief sought it will be in the favor of the Corporation to reduce the tolls, and relieve the Citizens of Jersey at once from their pressure, if they refuse they must be answerable for the Continuation of those Tolls in other Factors hands, & perhaps for the Extension of the powers of the Corporation — The Deputation have learned with unexpressed Surprise that at the sitting of the Society Committee on the 21st of January, Charges were made and urged, (as reasons for withholding Support from the Corp^o.) against the Expenses of that Body, and this Surprise is heightened by recollecting that those Charges were made at a time when the Deputation were in attendance upon the Society, and ready to answer or explain as might be required — The Deput. do complain of a course of proceed^s so obviously at Variance with that Candour which they wish to see in their own Conduct, and satisfied that those Charges are wholly groundless, consider it a duty they owe themselves and the Corp^o not to allow them to pass unanswer'd. In the purpose they request to be heard before the Society on Saturday next — Sign^d R. A. Ferguson Secy of J. S. Hall

The Charges alluded to were, as the Deputation learned, "that the Corporation had become so thinned and weakened, by the absence of some and the non residence of others that No one could be found to facilitate the duties of the Mayorcy"; The Deputation send^s I presume to their sitting Questions on Saturday next, and a full list of the Body and placed opposite to the Name of each member his residence so as to present at one view the exact condition of each Individual as reported by the qualifications, stating at the same time such Circumstances as appeared to the Deputation favorable to those Individuals whose temporary or occasional absence might without such explanations have elapsed them among the Non-residents, provided with this Document the Deputation waited upon the Society, and were Spectably introduced, where they proceeded to Notice the objections alluded to and read the list above ment^d. They called upon the Society to dispose of the question one way or other and in reply to some of the Numerous heterogeneous Observations made, as to the alleged desperate Condition of the Corp^o, they challenged full enquiry, & declared their readiness at that moment to go fully into the Consideration of their present State, and to demonstrate that it was not hopeless, if the Society would only extend a hand to help the Corporation to take their difficulties away, They at the same time represented the impudence of grasping at conclusions without due present premises or previous full examination, and the futility of meeting pro Bona fide of honor to dispose of a question which only required close enquiry to prove its own truth — The Deputation had some reason to think


