Articles Agreed upon the 28 Day of January 1609 between the R<sup>ts</sup> Honorable the Lords of his Majestys most Honorable Privy Council one the Kings Majestys behalfe on the one part, and the Comunitie appointed by the Council of Comon Council on the behalfe of the Mayor Comonality of the City of London on the other part. Concerning a Plantation in parte of the Province of Ulster, Which Articles were signed by the L<sup>ds</sup> Chancellor, Treasurer, S<sup>r</sup> Trea<sup>s</sup>urer, S<sup>r</sup> Privy Seal, S<sup>r</sup> Chamberlain, Earl of Worcester, Earl of Dunbarre, S<sup>r</sup> Touch, S<sup>r</sup> Knolles, S<sup>r</sup> Stantrape, S<sup>r</sup> John Herbert, S<sup>r</sup> Julius Caesar and on the other part, on the behalfe of the City by S<sup>r</sup> Henry Montagne, S<sup>r</sup> Tho<sup>s</sup> Snow, S<sup>r</sup> John Jolles, W<sup>m</sup> Chaine, W<sup>m</sup> Tolocxon, Nich<sup>s</sup> Leat, W<sup>m</sup> Dick Rich<sup>d</sup> Wright Martin Freeman, Jo<sup>h</sup>n Brand, George Smithes, W<sup>m</sup> Day, W<sup>m</sup> Granville, Jo<sup>h</sup>n Borer, W<sup>m</sup> Farrifon, W<sup>m</sup> Turner and James Hoggon

- 1<sup>st</sup> Impressis — it is agreed by the City that the Sume of 20000 sh<sup>l</sup> be Lent, whereof £ 15000 is to be expended upon the intended Plantation and the other 5000 for the bearing of private mens interests in the things Demanded.
- 2<sup>d</sup> ly — It is agreed that at the Derry 200 Houes shall be built & room for 300 more, and that 400 Acres Lying on the Derry side, next adjacent to the City of Derry shall be laid therunto, Dog & brazier, mountain to be laid therof; but to go as Waste to the City, the same to be done by indifferent Commissioners.
- 3<sup>d</sup> ly — It is agreed that the Bishop & Dean of the Derry shall have certain Plots for the skat of their Houes at the Derry.
- 4<sup>th</sup> ly — It is agreed that Cairaine shall be situated and built on the Abbey side and that 100 Houes shall be built therein, & room left for 200 more, & that 100 Acres of Land shall be laid thereto, viz<sup>t</sup> 1000 to be taken on the Abbey side next adjacent to the Town & that if it shall please his Majesty at his charge to erect & maintain a Bridge in perpetuity for a Comon Passage over the River between the Town & the County of Cairaine, then it is agreed the other 2000 Acres shall be taken on the other side of the river; otherwise the whole 3000 Acres are to be taken on the Abbey side next adjacent to the Town of Cairaine.
